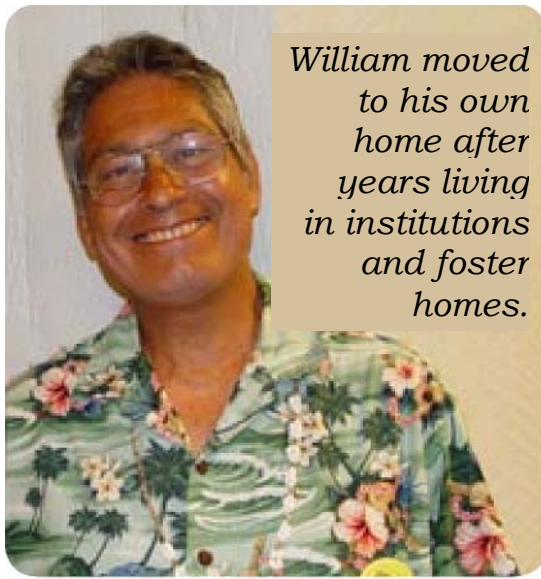

William moved to his own home after years living in institutions and foster homes.

Am I eligible?

You must be:

- Currently receiving Medicaid, and
- Living in a hospital, nursing home or ICF-MR facility for 6 months

How do I decide?

A transition coordinator will:

- Ask you if you want to move to the community
- Explain the available services
- Review your medical record
- Make sure you understand, and
- Work with you to plan the move.

What are my housing possibilities?

- Your own home (with modifications if needed)
- Senior housing apartment
- Public housing unit
- Adult foster home

What are some services I can get?

- Nursing and medical services
- Personal-care assistance
- Home-delivered meals
- Transportation
- Emergency response system
- Medical equipment and supplies

What if I have some problems with my new home?

- The case manager will help you with the problems.
- The case manager will talk with you to help you make decisions.
- The case manager will help you find another place to live, if you need to move.



John wants to move home after four years in hospitals and nursing homes.

Your choice to participate (or not to participate) in the Going Home Plus Project will not affect your eligibility for Medicaid or home and community based services.
