DRIVING FORCES BEHIND SUCCESSFUL POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT FOR YOUNG ADULTS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES AND AUTISM

Participants will gain knowledge, problem-solve, and learn new strategies for applying the principles of inclusion and self-determination when working together as interagency teams. Team members will develop skills to assemble interagency supports, services and accommodations for persons with Intellectual Disabilities and Autism in postsecondary education, with an outcome of meaningful employment.

Conference participants are encouraged to come as local teams comprised of two or more representatives (college or university disability support personnel, transition specialists, education administrators, rehabilitation counselors, regional center administrators and counselors, parents, persons with disabilities and their advocates). Teams will engage in discussions and problem solving.

Several noted local and national experts will be on hand to present and contribute to the discussions, Dr. Robert Stodden will provide insight for promoting inclusive strategies via person-centered protocol and interagency team building to support youth success in higher education and employment. Debra Hart and Cate Weir will discuss the Think College Standards-Based Conceptual Framework and its use in the continuous improvement of inclusive postsecondary education opportunities for students with intellectual disability.
